House Moving and Salvaging Program Coordinator

The City of Richmond is currently looking to hire a Temporary Full-Time Program Coordinator to coordinate the implementation of the City's House Moving and Salvaging program, which will involve relocating existing houses and salvaging building materials from demolition sites, and provide an opportunity to maximize the amount of materials that can be recycled.

The successful incumbent will be required to perform independent research, provide advice and recommendations on program development, fine tune processes, provide direction to inspections and plans processing staff in relation to program objectives, and prepare reports and conduct presentations as needed.

Examples of other key work activities include, but are not limited to:

- Communicating and corresponding with developers, house moving companies, builders, material salvage companies and home owners to promote the program and determine criteria for moving houses and building materials salvage.
- Consulting, communicating and cooperating with other municipalities to determine their needs around moveable houses.
- Assist in establishing communications between house movers and other municipalities.
- Provide a list of potential moveable houses to other municipalities based on their needs and criteria.
- Develop an online list for houses scheduled for demolition to allow house moving companies to contact home owners arranging for potential house moves.
- Liaising with other City Divisions to establish and streamline criteria for house moves.
- Providing information on the program to the public.

Position Requirements:

Completion of a Bachelor degree in Engineering, Architecture, or another job related field; supplemented by a minimum of three (3) to five (5) years of job-related work experience, inclusive of experience with the Building Code and proficiency in reading construction drawings. Previous work experience in a Civil, Structural or Mechanical Engineering setting is preferred. Experience working in a municipal setting is considered an asset. An equivalent combination of education and experience may be considered.
