## Question:

Sentence 7.4.2.1. (4) states that "A soil-or-waste pipe that serves more than one clothes washer, and in which pressure zones are created by detergent suds, shall not serve for connecting other soil-or-waste pipes."

What are the locations of suds pressure zones and how far along the drainage piping do they extend?

## Interpretation:

Suds pressure zone locations are discussed and illustrated in the ASPE publication "Engineered Plumbing Design II". The drawing on Page 2 is an illustration similar to that found in this publication and may be used to locate pressure zones created by clothes washer suds.

It should be noted that although Appendix B contains some commentary regarding suds pressure zones, it does not provide the code user with a clear indication of where suds pressure zones exist within a drainage system.
