Question:

- 1. Is a water service pipe on private property regulated by the B.C. Building Code and if so what sections of the code would apply?
- 2. When does the authority having jurisdiction change?
- 3. If a water service pipe from an owners private water source is located on the subject property does the B.C. Building Code apply?

Interpretation:

1. Yes

Div. A Part 1. Clause 1.1.1.1(1)(n) indicates this code applies to the design, installation, extension, alteration, renewal or repairs of plumbing systems which by definition includes a water service from a private water supply system located on the same property.

2. Div. A Part 1 Clause 1.1.1.1(2)(a) indicates that this code does not apply to services such as sewage, water, electrical, telephone, rail or similar public infrastructure systems located in a street as defined in Div. A Part 1 Article 1.4.1.2. or public transit right of way located on or through private property.

3. Yes

For the same reasons indicated in the answer to Question 1.
