## Question:

Except for Disabled and Special Medical Facilities Access Requirements, what *fixture* clearances should be maintained for all *building* uses?

## Interpretation:

The 1998 BC Building Code is silent regarding specific dimensions and simply states in Sentence 7.1.5.2.(1) that "Every fixture, appliance, interceptor, cleanout, valve, device or piece of equipment shall be so located that it is readily accessible for use, cleaning and maintenance."

Plumbing Officials' Association of British Columbia (POABC) Interpretation #1056 has recommended fixture clearances that may be taken as one example of dimensions meeting the "readily accessible" criteria. (see attachment – 2 pages)
