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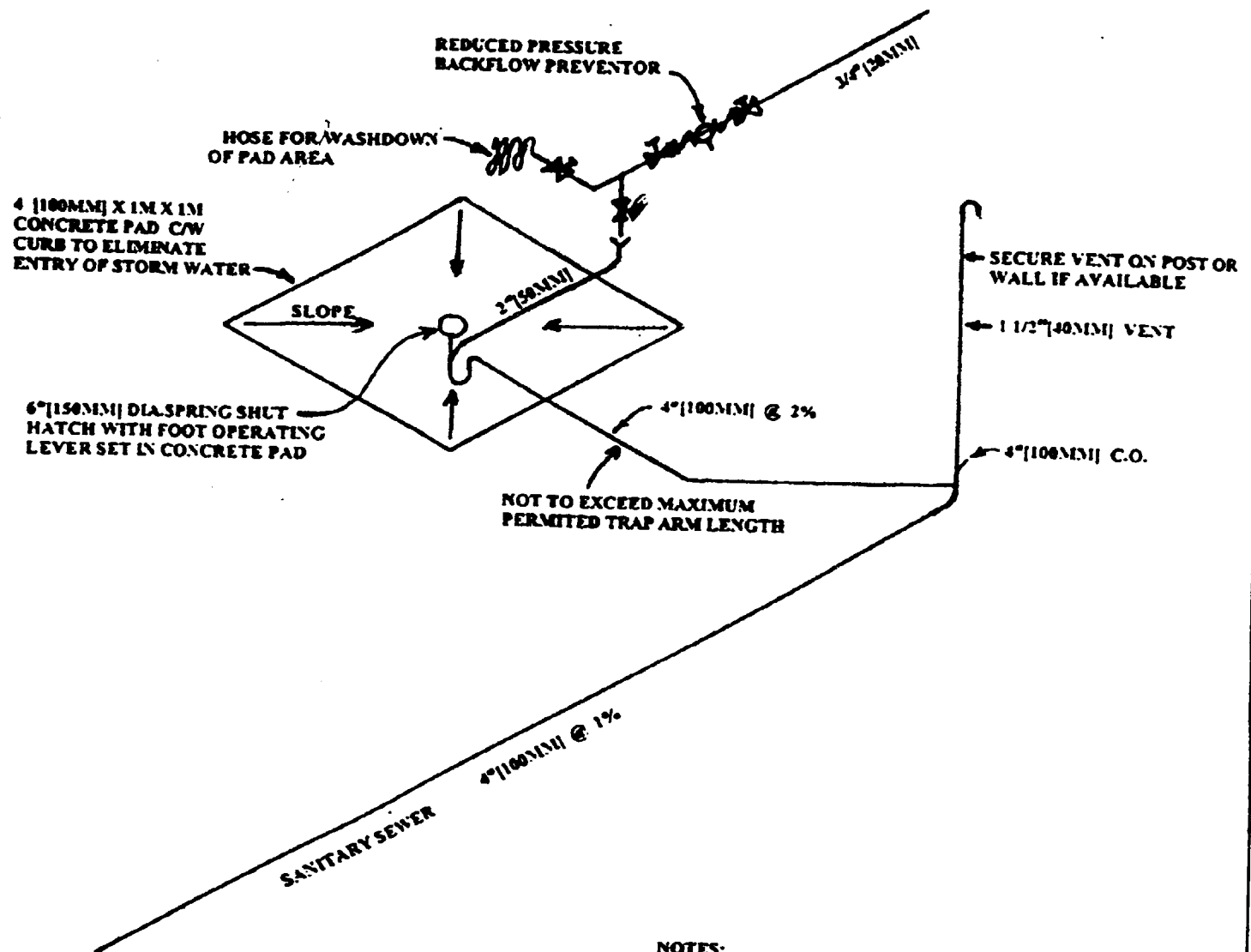


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- NOTES:
1. POTABLE WATER SUPPLY TO BE LOCATED IN AN AREA REMOTE FROM THE SEWAGE DISPOSAL
 2. FROST PROTECTION REQUIRED FOR EXPOSED WATER SUPPLY PIPING AND BACKFLOW PREVENTOR
 3. SIGNS MUST BE POSTED INDICATING WATER SUPPLY AT THE DISPOSAL AREA IS NOT FOR POTABLE USE. DO NOT DRINK
 4. DRAINAGE SYSTEM TO BE PROTECTED FROM FROST
 5. SANITARY DRAIN AT THE PAD SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO STORM WATER ENTRY
