

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH VANCOUVER BUILDING INSPECTOR (Temporary Full-time)

The Community Development Department – Inspections Division requires a temporary full-time Building Inspector for approximately two (2) years.

You will perform inspectional, regulatory and enforcement work related to building construction. Specifically, you will be able to undertake detailed plan reviews of building permit applications; conduct detailed inspections of buildings (Part 3 and Part 9) under construction; prepare related reports and correspondence; maintain records and research information related to construction techniques and materials.

You must have knowledge of inspection, regulatory and enforcement work related to building construction and current trade practices; thorough knowledge of the BC Building Code; the ability to read plans and specifications; the ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing; and, possession of a Carpentry TQ and / or Diploma in Building Technology or a related field. Prior experience in a municipal inspector's role and BC Building Officials Association certification along with experience in permitting software (the City is currently using Tidemark Advantage) would be considered an asset. Proficiency in Microsoft Office and use of mobile computers (iPad) is also required.

You will be required to provide your own transportation in return for reimbursement according to the Vehicle Policy.

For temporary full-time positions of 8 months or longer, a City employee who is successful on the posting will have the right to revert to their former position.

Hours of Work:

The City of North Vancouver currently works on a compressed work schedule of 8:30 am to 5:00 pm, Monday to Friday, with one scheduled day off (Monday or Friday) approximately every 3-week scheduling cycle.
