Question:

Is a piped water supply required to provide potable water to a dwelling unit (single family dwelling)?

Interpretation:

Nο,

Sentence 9.31.3.1.(1) of the British Columbia Building Code (BCBC), states that "Every dwelling unit shall be supplied with potable water."

Sentence 9.31.3.2.(1) states "Where a piped water supply is available, piping for hot and cold water shall be connected to every kitchen sink, lavatory, bathtub, shower, slop sink and laundry area."

A piped water supply may not be available to provide potable water to a dwelling unit, in some circumstances, and the BCBC would not prohibit an alternative source of potable water being utilized. It is the responsibility of the owner/applicant to provide the appropriate information as required by Division C, Part 2, Sentence 2.2.2.1.(1) showing conformance with the BCBC.
