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7.5 Regional Issues

- Calculation of limiting distances as applied to small buildings as per 9.10.15.4.(1).c)
 - 9.10.15.4 Sentence 1, 3 options are given as a path to calculating area of glazed openings in an exposing building face. I just had a project where a garage was 2m from a PL (LD = 2m); area of the face was 200 sq.ft (18.6 sq.m).
 - Using table 9.10.15.4, 24 sq.ft of glazed openings is permitted.
 - Using C option, 2x2=4 sq.m or 43 sq.ft of glazed openings is permitted.
 - Discussion Andy got a response from BSSB As building EBF gets larger, the typical way for calculating LD as per 9.10.15.(1).(a) becomes more restrictive and applicable. So, this is not so much an issue with larger buildings.
 - Andy will bring the question higher up the chain to Zac from BSSB for further feedback on the matter.
 - Updating permit fee schedules with Building Bylaw Revisions Group discussion as to how to approach bringing fee schedules and permit fee calculation square-footage numbers up to current and realistic numbers.
