Are visible signal devices required within dwelling units?

Interpretation:

No (with exemptions).

Generally, as per Sentence 3.2.4.19.(1) visible signals that are part of a fire alarm system are not required in suites of residential occupancies.

Clause 3.2.4.19.(1)(g), Sentences 3.2.4.20.(7) and (8) require 10% of hotel and motel rooms to be equipped with visible signals, so if such rooms are equipped with kitchens, they would be defined as dwelling units.

A rough in for future visible signals is required in adaptable dwelling units as per Sentence 3.2.4.19.(7).
