## Question:

Can the openings required between combination rooms have closures?

## Interpretation:

No.

As per Article 9.5.1.2. and Notes A-9.5.1.2. combination rooms are when two areas are linked together with the opening minimum 3 sq.m. or 40% of the dividing wall, whichever is larger.

This opening cannot be obstructed, to allow exchange of the ventilation and natural light between the 2 rooms.
